

changed the surname to McCrie






William McCREE was born in Ayrshire, Scotland, June 10, 1802, eldest in a family of four children. Received a liberal arts education, studied classical languages Latin + Greek.

1831 He married Margaret (nee Miller). She ~~was~~ ^{had been} born in 1812. They lived in Kilmarnock where most of their nine children were born. William taught ~~school~~ at Woodhead School, 4 miles from Kilmarnock. They attended church in Galston.

1852 William and his family set sail in June, intending to settle in Illinois. Arrived in Hamilton, Ontario (via Quebec + Montreal) on Aug 1. Stayed in Scottish settlement there for a few years, where William served as foreman of public works. He admired Thomas McCrie, Scottish religious historian, so adopted McCrie for surname.


- 1853 Son John went to Grand Haven, ^{Michigan}, where he worked for Grand Trunk Railroad as a carpenter, building bridges and railroad cars.
- 1854 William sent son Hugh to Sarnia with Boyle family to locate homestead land. Hugh bought 100 acres near Mandaumin; cleared land & built a small loghouse; then sent for mother, she brought 4 year old Matthew with her.
- 1855 Family was reunited in Mandaumin. Jane was married ^{in 1853} & living in Grey County; John was working in Grand Haven.
- 1856 Son Hugh died August 26th, succumbing to malaria or typhoid fever. Unmarried.
- 1858 or 60 James went to Grand Haven to work with John. About 1865-70, William joined his brothers in Grand Haven.
- 1860 Son David went to Grey County to farm widowed sister Jane's farm.
- 1870-72 John married Eliza Wilson } Both families lived in Grand Haven, Michigan.
- 1872 James married Anna Anthony } Michigan
- 1873 William returned home to Mandaumin to manage the homestead farm.
- 1873 Son Matthew married Roxanna Harrington in Sarnia on Dec 6, 1873
- 1876 Son Andrew married Janet Elliot on Dec. 20. in Sarnia
- 1876-80 Son David married Emily Tucker in Grey County
- 1882 William died, ~~his~~ widow lived on homestead with ^{son} William who farmed.
- 1887 Margaret ~~died~~ died at Mandaumin on May 23
- Don William married Matilda (Tillie) Dunsmore, & they lived in the family homestead.



John McCrie Eliza (nee Wilson)



- 1834 John was born in Scotland July 26, eldest son, second child in family. Learned carpentry as trade in his native land.
- 1852 Came to Canada with family. They settled in Hamilton, Ontario
- 1853 John left home & went to work for Grand Trunk Railroad at Grand Haven, Michigan, as carpenter, building bridges and railroad cars.
- 1858-60 John sent for ~~for~~ brother James to come & work at carbarns. James learned carpentry as a trade there.
- 1865-70 younger brother William joined his brothers in Grand Haven; also worked in the carbarns as carpenter.
- 1870-72 John married Eliza Wilson James married Anna Anthony } both families lived in Grand Haven, Mich.

- 1882 Father William McCrie died at home in Mandaumin.
John & James moved their families to Detroit, Michigan, where
the brothers went to work at the carbarns. John rose to
foreman. Brother William had returned to family farm at
Mandaumin a few years earlier, and lived with his widowed
mother.
- 1886 John's wife Elija died in Detroit on Sept. 26, within a year
or two he married Bertha Burrows, who took care of his
two children by the first marriage.

- 1888 In an accident at work, John was hit on the head ~~as~~^{as} a heavy beam fell. His health declined as a tumor developed.
- 1890 John died on January 12.
- 1892 ~~Son~~ Son William died on June 9th.
widow Bertha and daughter "Dolly" continued to live
in home on Commonwealth in Detroit.
- 1925 Daughter Dolly died on May 23, succumbing to a
jaundice ailment.
- 1930 widow Bertha died on November 8th.

John, as the eldest son, looked after his younger brothers; routed them out of troubles and into employment. During his working years in Detroit he accumulated ~~property~~ a few properties in Downtown Detroit.

Hugh McCrie (1836-1856) single

- 1836 Hugh, third of nine children, was born to William & Margaret (nee Miller) McCrie in Scotland on November 2.
as a boy he sailed as far as California, and was much impressed.
- went to Liverpool and studied Law and Accountancy under guidance of his uncle, John Miller, brother of his mother.
- 1852 Hugh emigrated with his family to Hamilton, Ontario
1854. ^{In June} Father William sent son Hugh with the Boyle family to secure a homestead. He purchased and cleared ~~a~~ 100 acre tract near Mandaumin. Built a small log house; then sent for his mother. Mother Margaret brought 4 year old Matthew with her



1855 Family was reunited in Mandaumin, except big sister Jane who had married & lived near Durham, and brother John who was working for Grand Trunk Railroad in Grand Haven, Michigan.

1858-60 James went to join John in Grand Haven, Michigan. In the carshops where

railroad cars were built, James learned the carpentry trade.

1865-70 Younger brother William joined his brothers in Grand Haven, Mich.
By 1873, William had returned to family homestead near Mandaumin where he helped on farm, & aided ^{younger} brothers Andrew & Matthew establish their homesteads before they married in 1876 and 1873 respectively.

1870-72 ^{Brother} John married Eliza Wilson. Subsequently they had 3 children.
James married Anna Anthony.

William died 6-9-1892
Edith D. "Dolly" died 5-23-1925
Baby died in infancy.

1873 Daughter Jennie Eliza was born on November 19.

1878 Son James Wellington was born on June 18.

1882 Father William McCrie died at the family homestead in Mandaumin. about that time John and James moved their families to Detroit and the brothers worked in the carshops in Detroit. John rose to foreman.

1886 Brother Johns wife Eliza died on Sept. 26th in Detroit. Within a year or two, he married Bertha Burrows.

1887 Mother Margaret McCrie died at Mandaumin on May 23. about this time ^{brother} William married Matilda Dunsmore & they lived on the homestead.

1888 At work, brother John was hit on the head as a heavy beam fell. His health failed as a tumor developed, ~~and he~~ died on Jan. 12, 1890.

1890 John ~~died on January 12th~~, son William died on June 9th. Widow Bertha & daughter Dolly continued to live on Commonwealth Avenue, Detroit for many years. Dolly died 5-23-1925. Bertha died 11-8-1930

1888-93 Sometime in this period, James changed employment. He worked in a grain elevator in Detroit & rose to foreman. Later, the dust effected his lungs so he had to retire.

James and Anna kept roomers in their large home near downtown Detroit, and rented out other properties they owned in the neighborhood. Although James worked twelve or more hours a day on the job, he spent his time at home building cabinets, window seats, shirt boxes, etc. He enjoyed woodworking and used his carpentry skills to add conveniences to the household. He often read aloud to the family. His favorite physical activity was walking.

1912 James Miller McCrie died on February 29.

Widow Anna continued to live in home with daughter Jennie. They kept roomers, and Jennie was employed parttime in secretarial office work.

Son James Wellington McCrie married Sarah Livingstone in Detroit, June 25, 1912, and lived within a block of Anna's home on 14th Street. James had Business School training and was a cost accountant.

- 1914 Grandson William James McCrie was born March 23.
- 1915 Granddaughter Margaret Lilian McCrie was born April 22.
- 1917 Granddaughter Jean Campbell McCrie was born February 11.
- 1928 Anna (^{nee} Anthony) McCrie died on May 29, in her 81st year.
Daughter Jennie continued to live in the old home alone.
- 1940 Granddaughter Margaret Lilian McCrie married Maxwell Melvin Mead in Detroit on Sept. 13.
- Grandson William James McCrie married Greta Maxwell on October 19th. They live in upper flat of J.W. McCrie home.

- 1940 Son James Wellington McCrie died on October 19th.
widow Sarah ~~and~~ lived at home with her youngest daughter Jean.
- 1941 Granddaughter Jean Campbell McCrie married Leonard Thomas Schutze on September 27. They ~~lived at home~~ with Sarah.
- 1943 Great grandson James Stewart McCrie was born to William James and Greta McCrie on March 24th in Detroit
- 1945 Great granddaughter Elizabeth Jean Schutze was born to Jean & Leonard Schutze on June 1st, in Washington, D.C. where Len was employed during World War II on government cartography.
- 1946 Great granddaughter Janet Lee McCrie was born to William & Greta McCrie on March 28th in Detroit.
- 1946 Baby girl was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana, on March 30. She was adopted by Maxwell & Margaret Mead in 1952, eventually becoming another great granddaughter, Debra Ann Mead

1948 Baby boy was born in Detroit, Michigan on February 5. He was placed for adoption with Maxwell & Margaret Mead within a month. He became great grandson David James Mead.

The Maxwell Mead family moved to Fort Wayne, Indiana in Sept. 1948.


1949 Great grandson James Thomas Schutze was born to Jean & Leonard Schutze in Detroit on July 3.

- 1852 Emigrated to Hamilton, Ontario, with family. Left school after fight with
teacher.
- 1854-5 Elder brother John got him job as plumber's assistant. Drunk employer beat him
up; he quit and rejoined family at homestead in Mandanamin.
Worked on farm while father was teaching school.
- 1865-70 William joined big brothers John and James in Grand Haven where
they all worked for the Grand Trunk Railroad. Meanwhile
younger brothers Andrew and Matthew were working on farm at home.
- 1873 William returned home to farm, as ~~brother~~ Matthew married on

December 6th. Helped Matthew locate & clear land to live on.

1876 Brother Andrew married on Dec. 20th. William helped him clear his land.

William was only child at home, unmarried. Father William gave this son the home-place, with the provision that he help his brothers and sisters if they were ever in need.

William added 100 acres east ~~of~~ adjacent to the homestead to enlarge it.

1882 Father William died at Mandaumin homestead. His widowed mother continued to live at home with William, who was single. James & John moved their families to Detroit from Grand Haven.

1887 Mother (Margaret) died at Mandaumin.

William married Matilda "Tillie" Dunsmore in 1887. They continued to live on the ^{enlarged} homestead and raised a family of 4 children.

Home was burned to the ground. William and Tillie built
present home on the same location.







- 1910 David McCrie moved with his entire family out west and settled at Da





1855 Family was reunited at Mandaumin homestead, and Andrew lived there.


1873 Helped brother Matthew ^{younger} build his home ~~before~~ Matthew married in Dec.

Mary McCrie went to St. Louis, Mo. in 1907, to train at the Missouri Baptist Hospital School of nursing; graduated in ^{April} 1910. Did general nursing; then worked for Health Dept. of Bd of Education in St. Louis, 1915. During World War I was army nurse, went overseas in 1917; stationed in Rouen, France; patients were from England, Scotland, Australia, New Zealand, and a few from South Africa. Returned to Bd of Education as School nurse in 1919. Was appointed nurse in Sept. 1925 at new Elias Michael School for Crippled Children. Retired in June, 1956.

Home with niece Lucille Keigher; garden, outside activities & friends keep her busy.

Elizabeth Jane lived on the homestead ~~at~~ at Mooretown. Made a home for her elderly parents, who died there. Elizabeth married John Stubbs, a widower, who had two young children (twins Gertrude & Sammie) whom Elizabeth raised. Mr. Stubbs died at Mooretown.

Annie Maude married George Bowman and they lived in Toledo, Ohio. She suffered spinal curvature and was crippled. They had three children. Annie died in Toledo on 11-30-1930.

George Bowman later married Annie's cousin Florence McCrie. She raised the three children on farm at Camlochie, Ontario, where they then lived. George Bowman ~~left~~ deserted the family.


Children:

William Douglas married Myrtle Brown. They live in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada.


