Yesterday Jackie brought us a card & letter
from Aunt Lily. Mrs. Kay is there with her
family & an air conditioned Cadillac, they
are staying in a motel near by and take
Aunt Lily sightseeing.

Norman & Effie are living in Oakland Calif.
now as Norman was transferred there. So they
are trying to have Mrs. Kay drive Aunt Lily
to Sacramento, they will pick her up there to
visit with them. In Sept. Norman has to make
a business trip to Chicago, and as we under-
stand it, while he is there they will put Lily on
a plane to Mich. Effie will fly on to Newark
N. J. to visit our Nancy who just had an infant
son, that lived just 24 hrs. and passed away
with some fluid problem, just as the Kennedy
baby had. Aunt Lily dry her letter ached
to be down in the mouth, said they have had
100° temp. and a long dry spell, with a water
shortage. (We just heard on 12 noon T.V. that they

After you had gone some time Mother noticed
James wet beach towel on the porch. It should
be dry by now still hanging there, unless Ma
has taken it down as she was just rinsing a
few things thru by hand.

When we take this letter into Pinckney we
will also mail the Wedding Card to
Dorothy, Jean Goodrich. We had already
sent our regrets that we could not attend.

This A.M. our back steps looked like we had
had a little rain during the night, but we
could stand a lot more of it, then maybe
Mother would get enough tomatoes to pay
for the plants. She looks at them several times
a day and I suppose has had over 50¢ worth
of fun out of it.

We spoke to Rita yesterday as we were leaving
for Pinckney, she said the gang went down to
Melfs & wanted to know if he wanted to buy
something, he gave them 50¢ and when he checked
what they had to sell, (they said bubble gum)
I wonder what they are going to do with the
money they got! Ma is fixing dinner for us
now, regenerating the mack & cheese Mela left
with us. We will eat at 1:30 P.M. while we
look at as the world turns.

P.S. By the way Nancy has 3 little girls and
she was married only 6 yrs. ago. Effie is all
broken up over her losing her little son.

Hope to see you soon to go fishing
again.
