GALSTON.

[Galston Village, distant 15 miles from Ayr, and 5 from Kilmarnock.]

GALSTON lies on the banks of the river Irvine, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the west of Newmilns. *Population*—In 1831, 3655; 1841, 4334; 1851, 4392. Increase since 1831, 737. *Extent*—The parish contains about 23 square miles; its greatest length is 13 miles, and its breadth about $4\frac{1}{2}$. *Boundaries*—It is bounded on the east by the river Avon; on the north by the river Irvine, which separates it from Loudoun and Kilmarnock; on the west by Cessnock Water, which divides it from Riccarton and Craigie; and on the south, by Mauchline and Sorn. *Character*—In the villages the population are engaged in handloom weaving for Glasgow and Paisley houses. There are at least 10,000 acres of arable land in the parish, which employ a pretty large number of agricultural labourers. There is a paper mill in the parish, and a variety of saw, corn, and flax mills. *Markets, &c.*—Four fairs are annually held in Galston—the two most frequented are held, the one on the third Thursday of April, the other on the first Thursday of December.
