HERMAN SCHUETZE.

Bro. Schuetze was born in Dresden, Germany, April 9, 1851. He was initiated in Masonry May 3, 1888, in a class which included Bros. Clarence Leonard and A. G. Pitts. He was raised to the degree of Master Mason October 11, 1888.

He was not well known in the Lodge, having lived many years at Stratford, Ontario. He was a sausage maker in the employ of the Whyte Packing Co. and was highly regarded by his employers.

He died March 19, 1909, of cancer of the liver. The hopeless nature of his disease was known to the officers of this Lodge before it was to him and arrangements had been made with the secretary of Tecumseh Lodge of Stratford, Bro. C. McLellan, to look after the last offices for us. By a strange fatality Bro. McLellan himself died suddenly a few days before Bro. Schuetze. So suddenly that a check sent to him by this Lodge to meet certain expenses connected with this case had to be returned to us because Bro. McLellan was no longer there to endorse it.

However both the Lodges of Stratford jointly took charge of the funeral which took place Sunday, March 21. At the home of Bro. Schuetze the services of the Lutheran church were first conducted by Rev. O. C. D. Klaehn. After that the Masonic service by Wm. Master Chas. Farquharson of Stratford Lodge. The Masonic service at the grave by Wm. M. S. B. Bray of Tecumseh Lodge. Seventy-five Masons were present. We cannot thank the Stratford brethren enough for what they did for us in this emergency.

Bro. Schuetze left a widow, three sons and a daughter. The eldest son, Leonard, is in California. The second, Herman, is an apprentice in the G. T. Railroad at Stratford. Hugo and Hattie attend school. Mrs. Schuetze has another daughter who is the wife of Bro. Paul Hager of this city, a member of Detroit Lodge and a frequent visitor in Palestine Lodge. Bro. Schuetze had been insured for many years in the Woodmen of the World.
