Under the heading "Cause of Death" should be entered, as fully as the space will allow, the chief circumstances attending the death. If a fatal accident occurs at or about the time of any injury to the ship, or to any part of it, or to the cargo, the fact should be stated. If a death occurs in port it should be stated whether it occurred on board or in hospital. If a seaman dies on shore from an accident which happened or a disease which developed while he was a member of the crew, it is desirable that an entry of the death should be made in the same way. As regards the account of wages and effects on form W. and E. 1 see note on the first page of this form.
